Case study | Lower Limb



Twisted right knee due to manual handling

A 39 year old man slipped on paving whilst at work on 24 June 2011, injuring his right knee. His employer referred him directly into QBE's minor injury management service for rehabilitation.



Rehabilitation

- The injured party was assessed six weeks post injury and was still reporting symptoms in his right knee but also his left knee and hip area, thought to be a result of compensation and over reliance on the unaffected leg.
- The injured party also reported confusion with his employer over the reason for his absence from work.

The case manager

- Arranged a private physiotherapy assessment which confirmed the primary diagnosis of a strained medial collateral ligament of his right knee. 3 sessions were funded, with the key focus being on self management – after which he made a full recovery and subsequently discharged.
- Liaised with the injured employee and his employer to resolve the misunderstanding as a result he commenced a return to work on 28 November 2011.

Results

- Mediation was provided between him and his employer, resulting in him returning to work 2 weeks post rehabilitation involvement - on 24 November 2011. Had this issues not been resolved it could have been a significant barrier to successfully returning the injured employee to work.
- A short treatment programme, focusing on self injury management resulted in a full recovery.
